

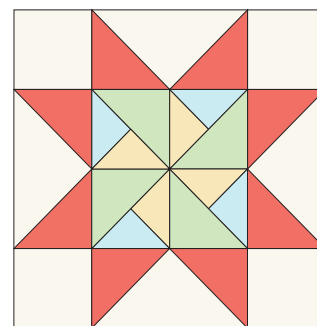

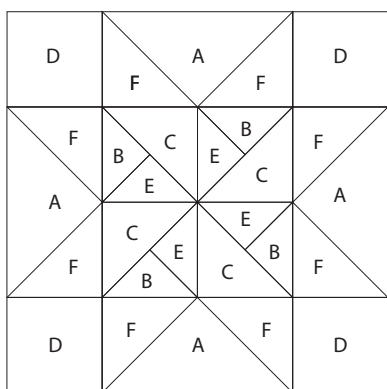

Finished Block Size 6" x 6"



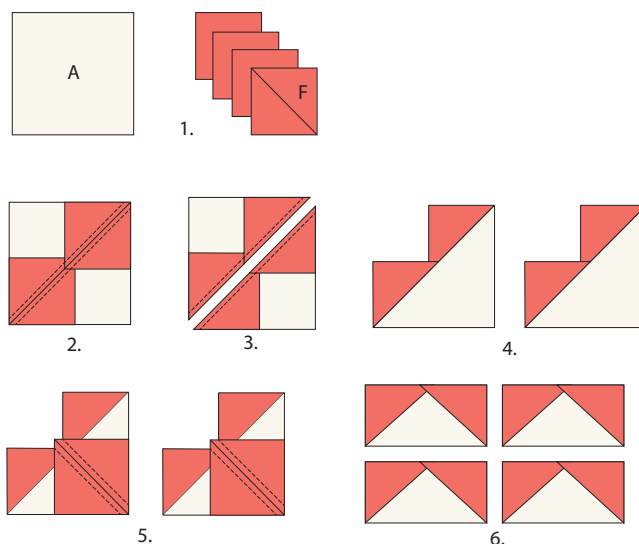
Cutting

- ✂ A: 1 square - 4 1/4" x 4 1/4"
- ✂ D: 4 squares - 2" x 2"
- ✂ F: 4 squares - 2 3/8" x 2 3/8"
- ✂ C: 2 squares - 2 3/8" x 2 3/8". Cut once diagonally
- ✂ E: 1 square - 2 3/4" x 2 3/4". Cut twice diagonally
- ✂ B: 1 square - 2 3/4" x 2 3/4". Cut twice diagonally



Flying geese units

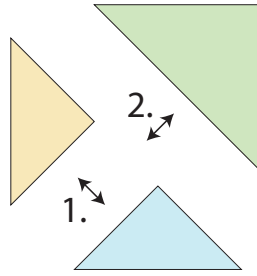
1. Select 4 1/4" x 4 1/4" square A and 4 - 2 3/8" x 2 3/8" squares F. Draw a diagonal line on wrong side of all 2 3/8" x 2 3/8" squares F.
2. Pin a 2 3/8" x 2 3/8" square F on opposite corners of square A. Sew 1/4" on both sides of the line.
3. Cut on drawn line.
4. Press triangles away from background block.
5. Pin a 2 3/8" x 2 3/8" square (D) on corner of background blocks. Sew 1/4" on both sides of the line.
6. Cut on drawn line and press triangle away from background block. Make 4 flying geese units.



7. Unfinished flying geese unit size 2" x 3 1/2".

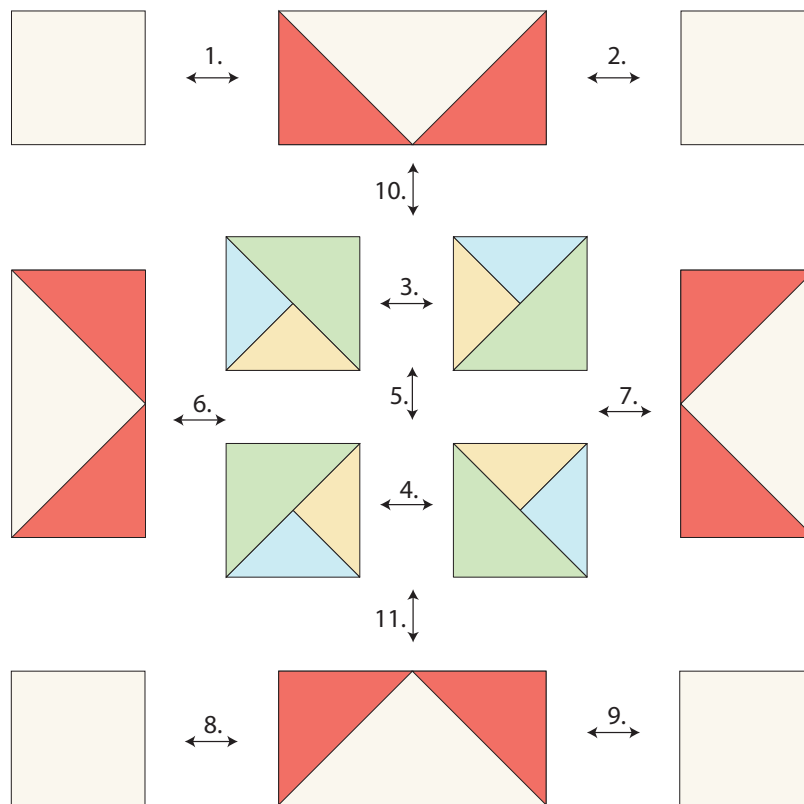
Pinwheel units

1. Sew a B and E triangle together. Press seam open. Make 4 B/E units.
2. Sew a C triangle to the B/E unit. Press seam open. Make 4 B/E/C units.
3. Unfinished pinwheel unit size 2" x 2".

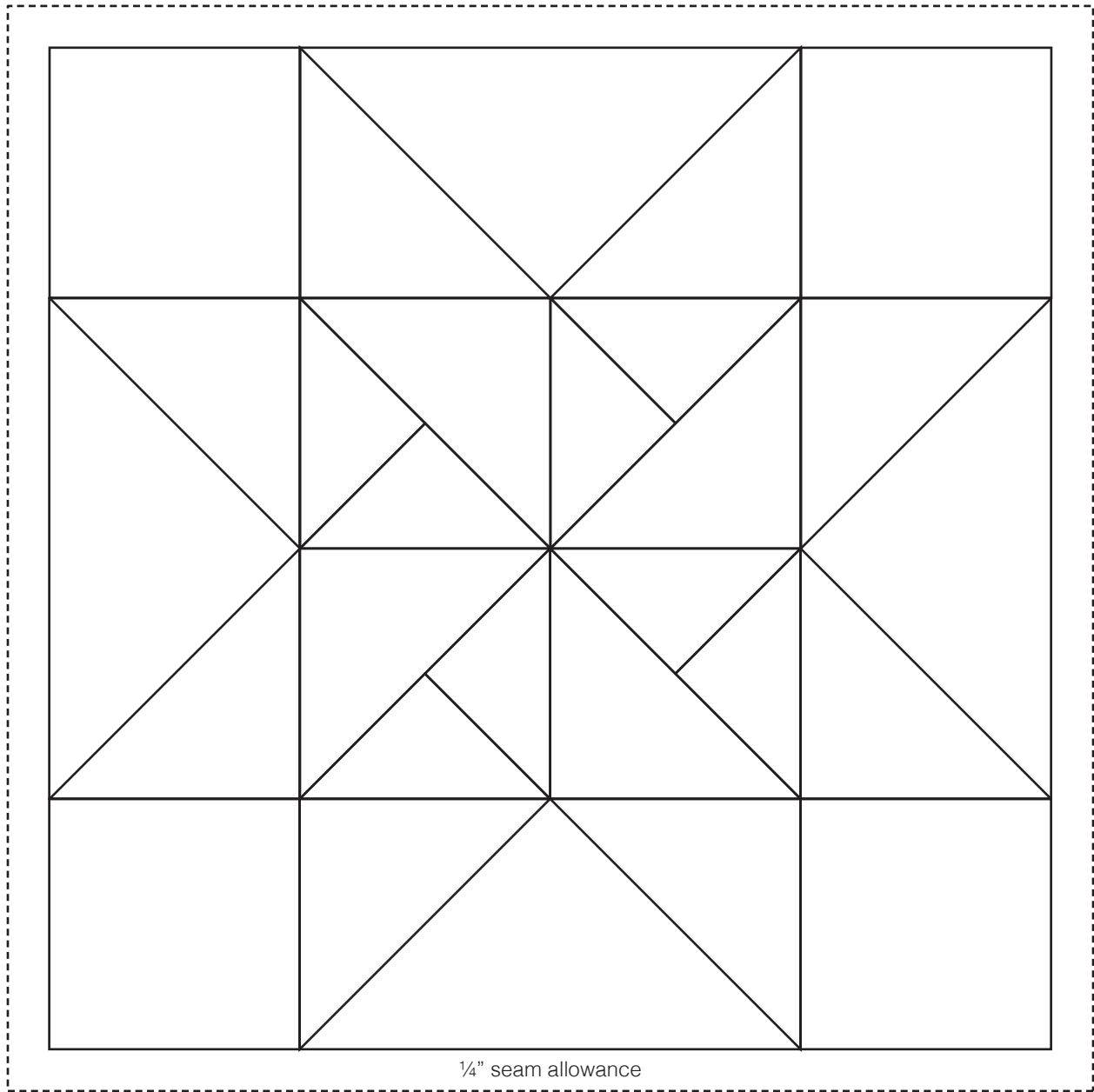


Block Assembly

1. Lay out block.
2. Join units and rows in the order listed in the block assembly diagram.
3. Press all seams open.
4. Unfinished block size 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".
